AN ACT AUTHORIZING
THE TRUSTEES OF STAPLES FREE SCHOOL IN FAIRFIELD TO SELL REAL ESTATE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

The Trustees of Staples Free School in Fairfield, a corporation specially chartered by act of the general assembly in May, 1781, are authorized to sell and convey any or all of the real estate held by said corporation, situated in the town of Easton, including the land with the building thereon in Easton Center known as the "Easton Academy", at such price or prices and under such terms and conditions as the trustees constituting said corporation, from time to time, shall find most expedient, and to invest the proceeds thereof in accordance with the law relating to the investment of trust funds, and to use and apply the income therefrom to the purposes of the trust, as set forth in that certain deed of trust from Samuel Staples, dated April 25, 1781, to Robert Ross, Samuel Sherwood and James Johnson, the original trustees and incorporators of said corporation. Said trustees shall continue to make reports to the superior court for Fairfield County, and shall give bonds, conditioned upon the faithful discharge of their duties, to the town of Easton, in such amount and form and with sureties, as may be approved by said court. Said trustees shall cause a certified copy of this act to be filed for record in the land records of the town of Easton within six months from its passage.
