

In Addition—Passed, October 1796.

Upon petition of the inhabitants of the parish of North Fairfield, in the town of Weston, shewing that Samuel Staples gave real estate and monies to trustees for the support of a school in said parish, and that said trustees have been incorporated, and were not made accountable to any board whatever.

RESOLVED BY THIS ASSEMBLY, That the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Fairfield, be authorized to examine and adjust with said trustees an account of their receipts and disbursements of the monies referred to in said memorial, and lodge a duplicate thereof signed by the presiding Judge and said trustees, in the office of said Court of Common Pleas, and that said Court be also empowered and directed annually, at time and place fixed on by said court, to adjust an account with said trustees or their successors, of the receipts and disbursements of the monies aforesaid, to be signed and lodged as aforesaid, and the necessary expense attending the adjustment of said account shall be paid out of the funds of said school.
